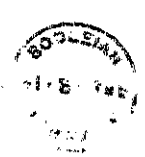

	OOTACAMUND TALUK No. 1 CEMETERY ATTACHED TO ST. STEPHEN'S CHURCH.
1825	24th April. In memory of Major <b>W. M. Robertson</b> , late 15th Regiment N. I., who died 24th April 1825, and his remains lie interred in the burying ground attached to Stone House, aged about 42 years. This tablet is erected by a few brother officers as a mark of esteem.
1828	13th April. <b>William Warren</b> , born May 1879, died 13th April 1828. "O Almighty God, we humbly commend the souls of Thy servants into Thy hands, as into the hands of a faithful Creator."
1830	21st September. <b>William Newmarch</b> , late Major in the 7th Regiment Light Cavalry, died 21st September 1830, aged 42 years. 1st December. <b>Charlotte Mary Selina Maria</b> , daughter of <b>Septimus Chippindale</b> and <b>Charlotte Mary Dundas</b> , his wife. OBIT 1st December 1830. <i>ÆTAT</i> 17 months and 3 days. 20th December. <b>Robert Donaldson</b> , Lieutenant, 6th Regiment M. N. I., 2nd son of <b>William Donaldson, Esq., M. D. of Ayr</b> , died 20th December 1830, aged 23 years. "Universally beloved and regretted."
1831	29th May. Sacred to the memory of <b>Helen Cramer</b> , the beloved wife of <b>Henry Dickinson, Esq.</b> , Judge of circuit in the southern division of this establishment, who departed this life at Ootacamund on the 29th May, 1831, aged 25 years. 1st June. <b>Samuel Smith, Esq.</b> , late Zillah Judge of Malabar on this establishment, who died at Ootacamund on the 1st June 1831, aged 41 years. 9th June. Sacred to the memory of <b>Jane</b> , the beloved wife of <b>N. W. Kindersley, Esq.</b> , Principal Collector of Tanjore. NAT 8th June 1805. OBIT 9th June 1831. "I shall go to her but she shall not return to me." 12th August. Under this tomb are deposited the remains of <b>Teresa Alicia</b> , the beloved and lamented wife of <b>W. F. Cockerill</b> , Surgeon of the Bombay establishment, she departed this life on the 12th of August 1831 in the 28th year of her age. 30th October. <b>Hildebrand Gordon Oakes, Esq.</b> , of the Bombay Civil Service, son of the late Lieutenant-General <b>Sir Henry Oakes, Bart.</b> , died 30th October 1831, aged 34 years "Deeply and sincerely regretted."
1832	3rd January. This tablet is erected to the memory of Captain <b>Andrew Gray</b> , 28th Regiment M. N. I., as a small token of the regard in which he was held by his brother officers, who departed this life on the 3rd January 1832. 7th January. <b>Rev. William Sawyer</b> , Chaplain, Madras establishment, who died at Ootacamund on the 7th January 1832, aged 35 years. 20th May. <b>John Mack, Esq.</b> , Surgeon to the Right Honorable the Governor's Bodyguard and to the Durbar of His Highness the Nawab of the Carnatic, who died at Ootacamund on the 20th May 1832.

1884	5th May. Sacred to the memory of Ann Boyd, daughter of Captain Malcolm <b>McNeill</b> , 6th Regiment Madras Light Cavalry and of Emily, his wife, died 5th May 1884, aged 9 months and 5 days. "Of such is the kingdom of heaven." 13th May. Captain George Henry Mitford <b>Dalby</b> , Bengal Native Infantry, died 13th May 1884, aged 32 years. "Hopeless should we be Blest revelation! were it not for thee; Hail Glorious Gospel! Heavenly light whereby We live with comfort, and with comfort die, And view beyond this gloomy scene, the tomb, A life of endless happiness to come." 20th June. In memory of George Mackenzie, son of Henry and Caroline <b>Blair</b> , who departed this life on the 20th June 1884, aged 2 years, and 9 months. 1st September. I., died 29th November 1885, aged 27 years. This monument was erected by his brother officers as a mark of their esteem for him whilst living and deep regret at his loss.

M.'s 11th Regiment of Foot and 2nd son of Viscount Lismore of Shanbally in the County of Tipperary, died 29th January 1886, aged 26 years. 3rd February. Eliza <b>MacLeane</b> , wife of Lieut.-Col. Thomas MacLeane, of the Madras Army, died 3rd February 1886, aged 49 years. 15th March. Sacred to the memory of John Solomon <b>Hall</b> , Esq., of Madras, who in the sure and certain hope of eternal life through our Lord Jesus Christ, departed to his rest at Ootacamund on the 15th March 1886, aged 45 years. Being early called through divine grace to the love of the truth, he was enabled for many years to adorn the profession of the Gospel fulfilling his duties as a husband, a parent, a friend, and citizen with christian faithfulness and integrity.
